(Welsbach Incandescent).-47 Petroleum.-62 Acetylene (Carbide at 20 per ton).-85 Electricity, at 4d. per B.T.U 1-68 In the estimate of the cost in the Welsbach system the amount is for gas only; if interest upon cost of special fittings and renewal of mantles be included, the comparative cost would probably be nearer-75. Acetylene therefore compares very favourably with coal gas, whether under ordinary or the more favourable incandescent conditions, whereas it is only about half the cost of electricity at the low rate of 4d. per B.T.U.
